Program Overview

The Saturday STEAMers Program engages students in hands-on learning that is designed to help them acquire and practice new concepts in different ways. Saturday STEAMers offers courses in Math, Science, Technology, Fine & Applied Arts, and life skills.

Courses run each hour between 9 a.m. and 12 noon every Saturday between February 17 and March 16. Each course meets for 50 minutes, and students may enroll in up to three courses during the program.

Registration

Registration submissions and forms are received and reviewed on a first-come, first-served basis.

Fees

Saturday STEAMers courses cost \$25 per student per five-week session. Students enrolling in more than one course need to submit payment for each course for which they are enrolled.

Some courses have a materials fee that is required to cover the cost of supplies that are used as part of the course. Typical materials fees are \$5/10/15 per course. Please refer to the course descriptions for specific materials fees.

For registration purposes, please include the materials fee for all first-choice courses. Any adjustments will be addressed following course placement.

Course Cancelation

A minimum of nine (9) students is required to run a course, and classes are capped at twelve (12) students. Courses that do not reach minimum enrollment will be canceled. Students in canceled courses will be placed in an alternate course and any tuition adjustments will be processed.

Withdrawals & Refunds

Should a student be placed in a course other than a First Choice, any tuition adjustments will be processed following the first day of Saturday STEAMers

Students who withdraw from the entirety of Saturday STEAMers due to medical emergencies or other extenuating circumstances will be provided a refund of tuition fees paid. Absences for individual days or sessions cannot be refunded.

Transportation

Transportation is *not* provided by District 75. Families may wish to carpool or make alternate arrangements so that students can participate in Saturday STEAMers
