A Note from our EL Teachers

A Note from our Specials Teachers

Art:

In art, 3rd grade students are putting the finishing touches on their construction paper shape robots and are gluing them onto their background sheets. In our next unit, we will be exploring the medium: oil pastels. The 4th grade students have completed their two abstract tempera paintings and have begun the process of cutting and weaving the two paintings together. The 5th grade students are also putting the finishing sewing touches on their "Ugly Doll"-inspired plushies and are looking forward to creating their legacy ceiling tile chalk pastel project.

Music:

In music, 3rd grade has begun to work on our annual music program, entitled "Our Musical World." This concert will feature songs from all around the world. Mark your calendars for April 17th, 2024 at 6:30 PM at CSMS. Check your student's backpack and your email for more information! 4th grade rocked their concert at the end of February. 4th graders are now continuing on with recorders in music class. Students now know the notes E, G, and A, and are beginning to add recorders into pieces of music with xylophones. 5th Grade spent February learning about Blues and Jazz music. Students tried songwriting and wrote their own Blues lyrics. Students also jammed out on xylophones to the song "Where Y'at?" by Trombone Shorty. 5th Graders have now moved onto a unit about Music in the Movies, and will soon become Foley Artists and learn how to use instruments to add sound effects into short movie clips. We had a great February and can't wait to see what the start of Spring brings!

PE:

Students are staying active in PE class and have been excited to get back outside with some surprisingly nice weather! Our volleyball unit was a huge success, where students learned to bump, set, and serve, while also playing in a class tournament. In March, we will continue with our racket sports unit in which students will be introduced to various sports such as badminton, pickleball, ping-pong, air hockey, floor ball, and spikeball. As we transition outside students will also be learning about lacrosse and practicing fundamental skills such as passing, shooting, catching, and scooping. We are also continuing to lead the PACK in PE with our ACTION Martial Arts partnership and the 4 lessons that have focused on aspects such as trust, ambition, teamwork, and leadership. This coincides with our daily habits of synergizing, sharpening the saw, and thinking win-win.

DD:

Last week in the Discovery Den, 3rd and 4th grade played musical books to preview many of the

books when the music stopped. They spent a few minutes looking through the books and wrote down any they were interested in reading. They will have this list to reference when they come to book checkout.

Now, 3rd and 4th are back to digital citizenship. Third grade is learning about how words can hurt as much online as in person and they are learning to STOP if they experience online bullying. This stands for Step away, Tell a trusted adult, OK sites first and Pause and think. Students learned to walk away, get help, only visit sites for kids, and think before reacting. Next they will be learning about why photos and videos are altered online. Fourth grade is focusing on the digital footprint and recognizing everything done online leaves a footprint behind and that your online activity is a reflection of yourself.

Fifth grade has been learning about searching for information on google. Often, they just type in their question, such as "What is a group of zebras called?" This is fine for basic questions, but when they need to search for more complex information, they need to use keywords to find the information and read through the results to find the answer. They are practicing this by selecting keywords from short paragraphs and then using the keywords to find answers.


